Our newest of what I hope will be an annual event is coming up on May 20th. Our "Ask the Experts" promises to be an exciting night for members and newcomers alike. Breeders, alert your puppy buyers to this event and those of you who have friends with Golden Retrievers, let them know they are invited. This is an opportunity to educate a broader community of Golden Retriever fanciers. I'd also like to encourage members to stay after the General Membership Meeting for the "Ask the Experts" evening and to extend yourselves to our attendees. Help them to find the right person to answer their questions, take time to chat, talk about what our club has to offer pet owners. Although we have a member formally acting as an aid, my hope is that attendance will be

significant enough that it won't be a one person job. The AKC is enacting new rules for clubs holding shows. By January 1, 2009, we must have fulfilled requirements for having contributed in a variety of ways to public education in order to be approved to hold a show. One of the ways that we can fulfill these requirements is by having educational events like our "Ask the Experts". Although 2009 doesn't seem that close, the fact is that the application to hold our show must be submitted by June/July of the previous year which means that we must fulfill our obligations between July 2007 and July 2008 in order to be approved to hold our Specialty Show in 2009. What it comes down to is that we need to implement a plan NOW to meet our requirements. This will be discussed at the next meeting and measures taken to assure that we are prepared to meet our obligations.

It does occur to me that we have over the years, withdrawn from more and more events, in particular, the ones that we felt garnered no profit to our club in monies or new memberships. We need to rethink our level of participation with the public and realize that there is a higher purpose than our bank balance and our membership roll.

I believe that the purpose behind A.K.C.'s new dictates is to have those of us in the fancy be the frontline in educating the public and promoting the ownership of purebred dogs. It's time we as a fancy rallied to protect our interest in continuing to own our chosen breeds.

It's about giving back.

Let's show 'em what we can do.

BGRC General Membership Meeting Minutes March 25, 2007

The meeting was held at WWCDTC in Ixonia, Wisconsin and called to order by President Sandi Haessler at 5:28 pm.

Minutes of the last meeting: Minutes of the February 4, 2007 meeting were approved as published in the February-March newsletter.

President's Report: Sandi Haessler welcomed new associate members and guests. She commented on the successful specialty and thanked all involved for their help including Sandy Flaaten and Chris Getter for their great work on the raffle.

Secretary's Report: Nothing to report.

Treasurer's Report: Joan Kaml summarized the major revenues and expenses associated with the specialty and reported the club's current checking balance.

Committee Reports:

Specialty: Joan Kaml reported on behalf of Edell Schaefer. Edell's full report will be printed in the next newsletter. Joan noted that several specialty positions are open for next year and encouraged members to volunteer. She also asked for suggestions for judges since the applications will be submitted in April. There was some discussion regarding enforcement of crate set-up rules that prohibit crate set-up until Friday morning. At least one BGRC helper set up a crate Thursday night in violation of the rule. This

needs to be strictly enforced next year.

Membership: Sandy Nelson and Stephanie Guenther were introduced as new members. Morgan Katzenmeyer attended as a guest and is interested in becoming a junior member.

Breeder Referral: Pat Smith reported on breeder referral activity. She has received 19 calls to date and provided a list of names and contact numbers. She noted that several callers asked for breeder recommendations. Pat clarified that the club does not recommend specific breeders. Calls have been slow recently.

Field: No report.

Obedience: No report.

Conformation: No report.

Old Business: None.

New Business:

1. New web hosting service: Bill McEachern reported on the move of the BGRC web site to a new hosting service. The web site was originally set up by Melissa Dais and administered through her account. The hosting contract was up for renewal in April. Since Bill is now serving as webmaster, it made sense to set up a new BGRC account. After reviewing several web hosting services Bill selected Infoquest, set up a BGRC account, transferred and renewed the domain registration, and uploaded the web pages to the new hosting service. Bill serves as the contact person for the account. Bill thanked Melissa Dais for her past service to the club.

2. Obedience trial success factors: Pat Smith distributed the results of a survey published in *Front & Finish* indicating that the facility and judges are the most important factors considered by exhibitors in selecting an obedience trial to enter. The full survey results will be published in the next newsletter.
3. Breeder referral work requirements: Pat Smith asked for clarification on the club work requirement for 2008 breeder referral listings. Sandi Haessler noted that this was not specifically addressed in the new policy and recommended the board take this up at their next meeting.
4. Meeting refreshments: Pat Smith suggested the club make complimentary refreshments available at the general meetings. This was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved.
5. May 20 general meeting: The next general meeting will be held at HAWS and will feature an "Ask the Experts" program. The program is designed for both members and the general public. It will focus on questions related to field work, behavior and training issues, and general pet maintenance. This program has a two-fold purpose: to improve the club's visibility and to meet our AKC public service requirement. Pat prepared flyers promoting the event and asked members to distribute them to other clubs, vet offices, friends, stores, doggy day care centers, rescue groups, etc. She encouraged breeders to include the flyer in their puppy packets. We will have a taco dinner and meeting at 5:00 pm then open the program to the

public at 6:30 pm. All members are encouraged to stay for the program and assist with hosting. Joan Kaml suggested running an ad in the paper in early May to promote the event. The board will discuss this at their April meeting.

Next Meeting Date: The next general membership meeting will be held on Sunday, May 20 at 5:00 pm at HAWS in Waukesha.

Adjournment: There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 6:01 pm.

2007 Specialty Show Chairman's Report

Please join me in giving a HUGE round of applause to everyone who was involved with our shows this past weekend – that includes club members, non-club members, the judges, the exhibitors, and the Sports Complex staff. While we can always use more workers, those who did help either day-of or throughout the year should be commended for their efforts. Even the temporary generator breakdown was handled in stride

and people gave us many positive comments. This was a team effort and the exhibitors' and judges' accolades are properly shared with all of you. THANK YOU!

Earlier in year there were some real concerns about the facility and our contract with the County. It took several months of negotiation to get the fee rolled back to a reasonable increase, and to adjust the terms of the contract for potentially expensive costs (i.e. insurance coverage, show entry fees). We also had to work with the two other breed clubs that share the facility with us to come up with a suitable layout. While we had been told and expected to have one-half of the building and ended up with one-third, it did work out well in the end. The conformation exhibitors loved the expanded and well-organized grooming area (thank you Sandi Haessler for that plan!), and the obedience exhibitors were quite content to have a greatly expanded and out-of-the-way area. I've already started talking with the other clubs and the County to secure the Sports Complex and layout for 2008.

We received many glowing comments about our judges' panel this year. The judges were also very complimentary of our club, the show and exhibitors, and our hospitality. Next year I'd like to find someone who is not exhibiting to be responsible for the judges. This person would need to make local arrangements for judges who are staying overnight, pick them up and return them to the airport, and transport them to and from the show site.

I was thrilled with the number of people who came to help set up on Thursday night. Given that this was a totally new layout, including a shared grooming/crating area, it worked out wonderfully well and we were finished in the two hours

allotted to us. (Just an FYI for the curious, we have to pay \$100/hour for set up.) Not allowing people to set their crates and grooming up the night before was very helpful. The exhibitors (with one exception) were very cooperative and didn't complain about not getting in until Friday AM. Since we only finished set-up about 15 minutes before the building closed it's likely that we will repeat this restriction next year.

My hat is off to the set-up crew: Larry & Joanne Hartzheim, Joan Kaml, Edell & Gary Schaefer, Pat Smith, Barb & Robert Weber, Bill McEachern, David & Linda Gensch, Sandi Haessler, John & Sandy Stoller, Chris Getter, Deb Lukasik, Sandy Flaaten, Lynne Forrest-Beman. John Stoller gets loads of extra Brownie points for transporting the equipment trailer after digging it out of an 8 foot high snow bank where it was trapped.

Haessler for the new placement signage.

I sincerely hope I have not left out anyone – omissions are unintentional and names are not listed in any particular order.

The raffle was awesome and it was hard to believe that Sandy Flaaten, Deb Lukasik and company pulled it together in about 6 weeks time! Rumor has it they are already planning for next year.

Many of our stewards were given a baptism by fire and did a capable job. I hope to see you back next year. It gets easier every time you do it, and it's a great way to learn about either conformation or obedience.

Bill McEachern, Carol Pacetti, and Pat Smith planned and staffed the worker hospitality table. 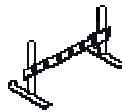

Rescue Situation. Posted March
28 by Carol Allen, Chair, National
Rescue Committee, GRCA: Last
week the US Department of
Agriculture closed down a
Bismarck Puppy Mill (Goldens
only) and immediately contacted
Rescue a Golden of Minnesota
(RAGoM). On very short notice
and with gallant effort, RAGoM
went and brought back to
Minnesota nearly 100 Goldens: 37
adult females and 11 adult males
(all allowed to mingle so how many
more females are pregnant is an
unknown), 5 females with 37
puppies (ages 3-8 weeks) and
another female about to whelp any
day. This is a huge under-taking,
and our thoughts are with the
Goldens (Free at last) and with the
RAGoM volunteers making it
happen.

This is a USDA closing so it
involved no auction and there will
be no lengthy court cases that
would delay the rehoming of these
many Goldens. RAGoM notified

me promptly and, in turn, the Golden Retriever Foundation. RAGoM put together their early financial needs very promptly and an emergency Rescue Fund grant was sent by GRF. Obviously, there are huge expenses involved in transport of a this number, and the immediate tasks of identifying, providing basic vet care, resettlement, is labor intensive and expensive. Long-term costs will add up, too...spay/neuter, follow-up vet care, and preparing a huge number of next-step opportunities. GRF's April Fund will be available if needed to assist with vet care finances.

An undertaking like this can always use additional financial support. See www.ragom.org. Of course, The Golden Retriever Foundation www.goldenretrieverfoundation.org will happily receive your contributions, but they cannot act as the pipeline for donations to benefit RAGoM only.

RAGoM is currently assessing what other kinds of support, if any, will be requested of other programs. Our rescue network stands by to respond as requested to do so by RAGoM.

ABC News shared this story with the local affiliates. A shelter near to RAGoM's home base was graciously made available as the initial staging area and for the initial reception of the dogs, basic vet care provided there, some bathing, etc. Unfortunately only shelter personnel were interviewed and there was no mention of RAGoM. Please be assured that Rescue a Golden of Minn. is totally involved and the "lead" organization in this effort.

Information From The GRF - Letter From Dr. Modiano. I wanted to personally write to thank the GRF for your generous sponsorship of our research project "Reciprocal Relationship of PTEN and p21 in Canine Cancer." Please accept our sincere gratitude for this support. I know you have received a note from Morris Animal Foundation, but it is very important for me to also acknowledge each and every individual and group that chooses to support our work. We can only conquer these diseases with help from people like you.

I would like to take this opportunity to tell you a little bit about our program and the goals for this project. As you may already know, our program has focused on identifying genetic factors that account for risk and susceptibility for cancer in dogs and people, with the ultimate goals to develop better treatment strategies, improve prognosis, and prevent the disease altogether in humans and their

companions. We are proud that our work has led to pre-clinical development of new approaches that may improve the outcome of both people and dogs with malignant melanoma, non-Hodgkin lymphoma, and other solid tumors. Results from our and our colleagues' laboratories indicate that the underlying properties of canine and human lymphoma and leukemia are remarkably similar, opening new avenues to identify susceptibility factors, to improve our assessment of prognosis, and to design new, more effective options for treatment of these diseases. Similarly, ongoing work has identified potential candidates that may define susceptibility to bone cancer in select dog breeds, and perhaps in children. Although much of this work is in preliminary stages, the potential applications for cancer prevention and treatment in dogs and in people who are at risk of developing these diseases are encouraging. Our diagnostic test to detect hemangiosarcoma cells in circulation continues along the road towards clinical development, and we have high hopes that shortly it will be available as a tool for early detection and to monitor remission status in treated dogs. The project you have chosen to support is meant to clarify the relative contribution of the protein "p21" in the course of cancer progression. We know that many tumors "inactivate" the PTEN tumor suppressor gene, and this is part of why the tumors arise in the first place. We believe that the loss of function of this gene results in several events that allow the malignant cells to grow, disregarding normal controls that would normally restrain them. The exciting concept about the role of p21 is that we believe the

inappropriate expression of this protein in PTEN-deficient tumors may be a major factor in therapy resistance. As we embark in our studies, the goal is to test this hypothesis, which if true, will allow us to design new targeted treatment approaches that will help sensitize otherwise resistant tumors like melanoma and hemangiosarcoma of dogs, as well as renal cell tumors of people to conventional therapy.

Again, thank you very much for your support. The progress we make is continuously updated through professional journals, newsletters, and seminars such as those sponsored by Morris Animal Foundation, selected breed clubs, and other organizations. Our eventual victory will be the legacy of our beloved family members (people and pets) who have passed on from cancer, but from whom we have learned so much. Responsible Dog Ownership Day.
This annual AKC event is set for September 15, 2007, all across the country. AKC will provide a dressed table, chairs, lunch for all volunteers and a stipend of \$60 to cover gas, tolls, parking and other incidentals. Although Sept. 15 is the beginning

of GRCA's National Specialty week in the Pacific Northwest, if there are members in the Greater New York City area who aren't going to the National and who would be willing to participate in a Meet the Breeds event, please let us know. We can send you all kinds of educational material and could also ship the Public Education Booth. For additional information, please go to www.akc.org/clubs/rdod/index.cfm

New Requirements For Show-Giving Clubs From AKC. The date of implementation for all breed clubs is January 1, 2008; for specialty clubs it is January 1, 2009.

Every Specialty, Group and All-Breed dog club that does not hold a benched show must meet certain criteria to maintain its eligibility to hold shows.

I. CATEGORY A ACTIVITIES:

If club holds a show they have to do one (1) of the following 5 items within 10 miles of club's territory. If club doesn't hold a show they have to do two (2) of the 5 listed activities:

1. An Independent AKC Sanctioned Match (Independent is defined as: A stand-alone event not associated with a licensed or member dog show.) with emphasis on attracting and assisting new exhibitors within their territory. Or co-hosting a multi-club match using the AKC Educational Match format to satisfy this requirement. (These large multi-club independent matches may be held outside the club territory)
2. In order to make matches interesting and more of an educational experience, the American Kennel Club has permitted clubs to experiment with types of events that may be used to meet this requirement. Clubs

have also been permitted to vary judging procedure, critiques and examinations by multiple judges, or other alternate judging procedures. AKC is willing to consider any reasonable proposal for holding an experimental-type match, but will require a detailed explanation of the event on the match application. NOTE: GRCA intends to apply to have the CCA meet this requirement.

3. A AKC Canine Good Citizen® Test

4. An Active Public Education Program – proof must be submitted to AKC Director of PEC For example, Youth programs (4-H, Scouting Groups, or active Canine Ambassador Programs) or Public Education Programs at community functions, civic organizations, public library programs, support of an AKC Veterinary Outreach activity, or other community activities within 10 miles of the club territory.

5. Other Educational or Outreach Programs Other club outreach or educational activities may be used to satisfy this Section A requirement if the club receives advanced approval from AKC Event Operations. In order to have an activity approved, the club must submit a description of the activity, the intended audience, and the location of the activity. Submit the description to: Director of the Event Operations, PO Box 37929, Raleigh, NC 27627-7929 (919-816-3579)

II. CATEGORY B ACTIVITIES:

ALL clubs are required to conduct and document at least two of the following eleven (11) activities in its area within the calendar year to be approved for the next calendar year's show(s). FOUR of these category B activities are required if the club's shows are held beyond 10 miles from the club's territory.

1. Conformation and/or Obedience/Rally, or Agility Training Classes Training classes that meet this requirement are those involving obedience, agility, or conformation and are advertised and are open to the public.

2. Breeder Referral Service The key to a meaningful breeder referral lies in making it known to the public that this information is readily available. The club must indicate how it advertises the referral service to the public. (i.e. on a club website, the local Yellow Pages or advertises in local newspapers, etc.)

3. Two Educational Programs for Club Members and the Public or Formal Judges Education. Clubs hold regular meetings and some of these meetings should involve educational programs that are of interest to the membership and the public. If the club is fulfilling this requirement, it should specify the dates of its educational meetings and give a summary of the programs for these meetings. Clubs are encouraged to invite the public to these meetings. Specialty clubs can satisfy this requirement by offering breed specific judges education programs including on-line presentations. (i.e. On-line video, Power Point, or similar presentations)

4. Dog Show Tours (May be conducted at events held outside the club territory) A formal educational plan and schedule of tours conducted should be submitted to document this activity.

5. Registered Handler Seminars or Workshops (May be conducted at events held outside the club territory) Clubs that provide AKC Registered Handler seminars that educate new exhibitors and/or junior handlers encourage new exhibitors and promote the sport of dogs. Judging operations will

document completion of this activity.

6. New Exhibitor Briefing (May be conducted at events held outside the club territory) New exhibitor briefings should help new exhibitors understand the dog show and feel more comfortable with the sport. The briefing must be publicized in the judging program and should include scheduled times. The briefing should explain the duties of the Superintendent or show secretary, the AKC Executive Field Staff, the event committee, the ring steward, ring location, exercise areas, and assist with grooming space. An explanation of dog show classes, points computation, and verification of placements (judges book tear sheets). The club must document the briefing in the show report submitted for the event.

7. Opportunities for Provisional Judges (Those judges approved for NO MORE than one group) (May be conducted at events held outside the club territory) AKC encourages clubs to provide new provisional judges with opportunities to judge. For those clubs hiring at least four provisional conformation judges, credit is given for satisfying this eligibility requirement.

As a general guideline, the suggested correlation between entries and number of provisional judges is:

(a) for entries of less than 1,000, a minimum of four (4) provisional; (b) for entries of 1,000 to 2,000, a minimum of six (6) provisional; (c) for entries greater than 2,000, a minimum of eight (8) provisional.

8. AKC Show Committee Seminars (May be conducted at events held outside the club territory) Event committee education contributes to a successful and well-run event. Clubs that provide this educational opportunity will be recognized for

this activity. Event Operations will document these seminars.

9. Disaster Planning Clubs that have an AKC-approved Disaster Preparedness Plan for natural disasters within their territory will be recognized for this activity. AKC Communications Department will document completion of this activity.

10. Meet the Breeds (May be conducted at events held outside the club territory) Meet the breed exhibits educates the public about the various AKC breeds and aids in creating responsible dog owners. The club must document the exhibit in the show report submitted for the event.

11. Health Clinics (May be conducted at events held outside the club territory) Health clinics sponsored by the show-giving club that are open to the offer specific health screening. Examples of acceptable clinics include CERF, Cardiac testing or other health screening examinations not generally offered by general practice veterinarians. The club must document the exhibit in the show report submitted for the event.

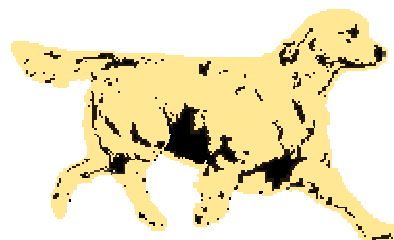

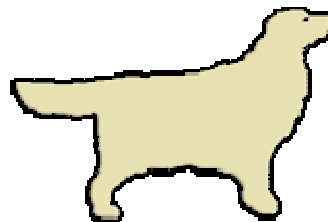
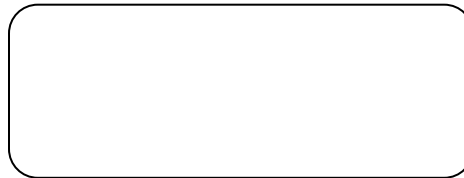
