BGRC General Membership Meeting Minutes March 30, 2008

General Membership Meeting
Sunday, March 30, 2008

The meeting was called to order by President Bill McEachern at 3:28 p.m. at HAWS.

Minutes of the Last Meeting: The minutes of the February 3, 2008 general membership meeting were approved.

President's Report: Bill McEachern thanked all people involved with the 2008 BGRC Specialty. Bill also pointed out there is an ad appearing in the April issue of Dog Fancy Magazine sponsored by BGRC and other Midwest Golden Retriever Clubs promoting the clubs as a source of information on Golden Retrievers. Bill mentioned that the 2008 membership list contained errors, and an updated list was sent to members via email/U.S. mail. The possibility of having a password protected membership list on the BGRC website is being explored. The Constitution and Bylaws are also available to be viewed on the website. Bill distributed a summary of club volunteer opportunities for the upcoming year for discussion under new business.

Secretary's Report: Nothing to report.

Treasurer's Report: Joan Kaml said that the Specialty Report is ready, and there was a profit of approximately \$1100.

Committee Reports:

Specialty Report: Joan Kaml thanked all workers and volunteers noting that everything ran smoothly for both days. Ideas for reducing costs for the specialty are being sought since costs are up and entries are down about 10 percent consistent with clubs in general. The new generator should help defray costs next year. Also, advertising will be available for next year's catalog.

Pat Smith mentioned the grooming area ran smoothly. Lynn Guerndt said there was a lack of chairs available at the site. Joan noted the chairs are rented;

Pat Smith said perhaps 12 chairs should be rented for next year. Pat also mentioned there were some negative remarks regarding lack of JAMS, no awards for Veterans, and no dog treats at ringside. Joan said that the entry did not support the requirements for having JAMS and that in lieu of prizes at the Friday show, there was a donation made to the Canine Cancer Fund. Lynn Guerndt mentioned that the dog treats were donated previously by lams.

Membership: Two new members were announced in the last newsletter, Cathy Williams and Gayle Pluta. Danielle Soine was present at today's meeting as a guest and is considering joining the club.

Breeder Referral: Pat Smith noted that she had some calls, but several calls were from out-of-state. Pat also mentioned that packets for puppy buyers are now available. Any breeders interested in including packets with their puppy materials should contact Pat. Pat stated that a breeder does not have to be on the Breeder Referral list to obtain puppy packets.

Jan Nyland asked if the Breeder Referral List was sent to area vets; Pat Smith responded that it was not. Bill McEachern said that breeder referral information was available on the webpage. Sandi Haessler suggested that breeder referral information could be reprinted and sent out again to area vets. Jan Nyland mentioned the Waukesha Kennel Club had a paid advertisement of breeders and trainers on their website.

Field: Bill mentioned the Hunt Test is scheduled for Sunday, June 15, 2008. Joan said the WC/WCX is being held on Sunday, August 10, 2008, with the Poodles. Both events are being held at Bong. Bill

reported that John Stoller is in charge and is putting together a committee.

Obedience: Nothing to Report.

Conformation: Nothing to Report.

Other: Nothing to Report.

Sunshine Committee: Jean Granger said that a card was sent to Mr. Peter Stager who was a Judge at the Specialty. Sandi Haessler asked that a card be sent to John Stoller whose mother had passed away recently. Jean Granger said usually a donation is made to the Zeke Cancer Fund in that type of situation.

Old Business: Last year, the board identified the need for job descriptions for the various volunteer activities. They plan to collect and publish descriptions this year to help members identify jobs they would be willing to take on. The board hopes this will improve participation and involvement in club activities.

New Business: Bill referred members to the volunteer summary he distributed earlier and there was a discussion of upcoming events.

Sandy Flaaten stated that she would be continuing as the Specialty Raffle Chair. Sandy also mentioned she had several people willing to help with next year's raffle.

The club picnic will be held on 7-20-08. Jean Granger is coordinating this event and would like assistance. Josie Trad will be giving a demonstration on dog tricks, and Shellie Rogers will be presenting a Search and Recovery demonstration.

Lynn Guerndt offered to coordinate the September meeting program featuring dog dancing. The date

and place has not been determined.

Joan Kaml and Edell Schaefer will be continuing in their roles for the 2008 Specialty.

John Stoller will be looking for volunteers for the June Hunt Test and the August WC/WCX. Job descriptions will be available.

Sandy Stoller is coordinating the Memorial Day Parade this year.

Pat Smith said that GRRoW is having their Reunion at the Western Waukesha County Dog Training Club on June 14, 2008 starting at 11:00 a.m. BGRC is participating in this event through an "ask the experts" program similar to what we did as a public education event last year. Pat is coordinating this.

BGRC will also participate in GRRoW's Dog Walk in October. Lisa Conigliaro will coordinate a dog demonstration and staff an information table at the event. Its purpose is to work more closely with GRRoW and to recruit new members. Pat Smith mentioned she is writing an article for their newsletter. Bill noted our work with GRRoW supports our public education goals.

Bill stated the Highland Games were chaired by Sandi Haessler last year; Deb Klemp offered to be the chairperson/co-chairperson for the 2008 Highland Games.

Pat Vanden Huevel offered to be in charge of the advertising for the Specialty catalog.

A program is needed for the November 16 meeting. Suggestions can be submitted for the board's review. Ideas for recruiting new members are also needed. Kathy Krueger mentioned there should be information at obedience clubs such as

invitations to join. Business cards will be brought to the next meeting.

Next Meeting: Wednesday, May 21, 2008, at 6:30 p.m. at EVS. The Wednesday evening meeting is being tried as an alternative to Sundays. The program will be on canine cancer presented by Dr. Calvin Kuenzi with members bringing desserts.
