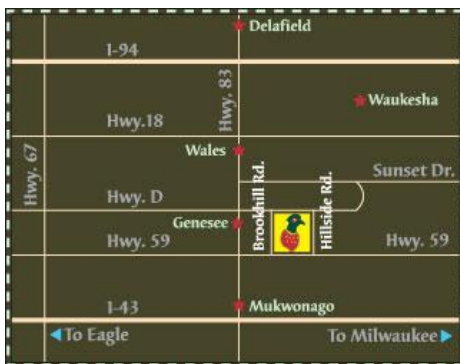

memberships with 77 members. At first glance, this seems like a lot of people to staff events like the specialty, hunt test, and WC/WCX; coordinate educational activities, recruit speakers for general meetings; publish our bi-monthly newsletters; handle breeder

referrals; maintain our web site; and the list goes on. Members are also the folks who make quality programs at our general meetings a possibility. We have all experienced the embarrassment at one time or another of introducing a speaker who has prepared an engaging presentation only to face a very small audience. This is discouraging not only for the speaker but for those Badger members who put time and energy into coordinating the program. We need your participation!

The reality is that about 23 of our 77 members are active in club activities: sharing the workload, attending meetings, serving in various capacities. This low participation happens for a lot of good reasons – we all lead busy lives, have multiple responsibilities, and cannot always be as active as we might want. However, I believe our club is at a critical juncture. We cannot continue to sponsor the events and activities of the past without broader participation.

The 2010 specialty is but one example. At our March meeting, I stood before a roomful of people asking for volunteers for next year's specialty. One person, a nonmember, volunteered to steward.

At our April board meeting, we considered alternatives to hosting an independent specialty in 2010. We will continue to gather information, analyze the options, and then report to the membership in the near future. It seems clear to me, and I think to the rest of the board, that this is an important time in our history as a club. If we want to continue to do the things we have traditionally done as a club to promote the breed, learn more about our great Golden companions, and become better handlers – whether in conformation, obedience, field, or other activities – we will need a

renewed commitment from our membership. Without it, we will slowly die away.

I apologize for presenting such a bleak outlook. I am relatively new to BGRC and perhaps the club has prevailed through similar times in the past. But the world in 2009 is different – busier, more complex, and at times stressful. The board and I hope you can help us address the challenges before us and help BGRC to be all we can be in the service of our Golden Retrievers. We look forward to sharing our thoughts with you in the near future and getting your input.

BGRC General Membership Meeting Minutes March 29, 2009

The meeting was called to order by President Bill McEachern at 7:17 p.m. A quorum was present.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes of the February 1, 2009, General Membership Meeting were approved unanimously.

President's Report: Bill mentioned he received an email from GRCA regarding the GRCA Junior Achievement Award. Bill also received an email from the University of Wisconsin Veterinary Hospital announcing an Open House on April 24, 2009, from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. More information for each topic will be available on the BGRC website and also distributed to members via the Badgergold listserv.

Secretary's Report: Carol reported that she sent a notice to Ellen Hardin of GRCA regarding the date of BGRC's WC/WCX to be held August 8, 2009, which will be published in the Golden Retriever News. Carol also had more blank copies of the Attendance sheets made.

Treasurer's Report: Joan announced there is a positive balance in the last bank statement of the club's checking account. Joan mentioned some checks still have not cleared, but a positive balance is still expected.

Committee Reports:

Specialty: Joan said the 2009 Specialty was very successful. Despite entries being down by \$1500, there was a profit. Joan mentioned there was a cost saving due to the change in venue. The judges' expenses were slightly more than last year. Lynn Guerndt thanked Cathy Williams and Bob Reed for volunteering as ring stewards at the Specialty. Lynn also thanked Joan for planning today's meeting and meal.

Membership: Sandy Stoller reported that she sent out information to a prospective club member.

Breeder Referral: Pat Smith mentioned she had 23 calls for puppies this year. Pat said she needs an updated breeder list and also said information should be sent out on request.

Field: John Stoller said the Hunt Test in June is cancelled and will be rescheduled for August 8, 2009. John also said the WC/WCX will be held the same weekend, but needs a chairperson who is a GRCA member. Pat Smith said that John should stay on as chairman of the WC/WCX. Jean Granger suggested BGRC pay John's membership dues. Sandi Haessler said the club should reimburse John for his dues. A motion to reimburse John for his GRCA dues was brought by Bill and unanimously approved.

Obedience: No Report.

Conformation: No Report.

Old Business: None.

New Business: Bill brought up the issue of a proposed AKC dog tax. Sandi Haessler said it was not in the AKC plans for now due to objection by several breed clubs. Bob Reed also confirmed this due to correspondence between the Irish Setter Club and AKC.

Bill said a new chairperson is needed for the BGRC 2010 Specialty since the current chairperson's health is uncertain. It was unanimously decided that, when the current chairperson's health allows, they will be able to continue in their position or as a co-chair. It was decided that that the board will discuss this issue at the next board meeting and move forward. Bill asked for members to volunteer to chair the Specialty.

Lynn Guerndt mentioned she had complaints from the Illinois exhibitors with regard to the Specialty. Those complaints concerned parking and temperature. Pat Vanden Heuvel had complaints regarding loading, parking, and ice. Joan said a person to direct parking is needed. Pat Vanden Heuvel said more help is needed at the site. Bill said he wants to try to get more people involved.

Pat Smith suggested the BGRC Specialty should go with the Combined Specialty at Waukesha in July which would bring in a lot of people. Pat also mentioned BGRC should look at other ways to draw in people from the membership to help. Lynn Guerndt suggested State Fair Park in March as another venue, as more handlers would be able to enter. Pat Smith suggested Olympia. Joan said their rent was \$3,000 minimum. This would be taken up at the board meeting on April 15, 2009.

Lynn brought a motion to look into

Waukesha Kennel Club. Pat Smith said BGRC was a member at one time, and there are benefits to joining the Combined Specialty, those being sharing of judges from their list or picking our own; joining for \$100 with \$25 for dues. It would have people to help with obedience in the air conditioned arena. We would need a contact person. The superintendent is Onofrio, and expenses would be shared with other clubs. Profits would be based on a percentage per dog. Pat Smith also said BGRC was a member of the Combined Specialty for one year and made about \$800. BGRC would have to pick a chairperson. Bill said this would be discussed by the board to figure out a plan.

Joan said the Specialty dates are March 5, 2010, and March 6, 2010, and judges are needed now. Jean Taylor said there are time limits set. Judges from Wisconsin and Illinois were discussed. Steve and Joy Poole, Wayne Koutsky, Julie Cepulis, Anna Lorenz, Lynn Tamms, Cindy Pischke, Sharon Hodgen-Wood, Richard Wood, and Suzanne Hemminger were names of judges mentioned by members. Names of other prospective judges should be emailed to Bill or placed on Badgergold. Bob Reed volunteered to be chief ring steward.

Joan mentioned that Deb Lukasik from GRRoW said if BGRC took over the food preparation and sales at The Bark in the Park Dog Walk in October that BGRC could keep the profits. Joan asked for volunteers.

Adjournment: A motion to adjourn was made and accepted. The next General Membership Meeting is Sunday, May 31, 2009. The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

Fact or Fiction: The New Amateur Owner Handler Dog Show Class

Some things in life are simpler than they appear. The discussions I've had with people in regard to

the new Amateur Owner Handler class made me believe that there were many details to figure out about this class. What do you know about this new class?

Determine if each statement is **Fact** or **Fiction**. Check your answers on page 7.

1. The class was added to the list of regular dog show classes, effective January 1, 2009. Fact Fiction

2. The class is targeted at exhibitors who want to compete against their peers rather than more experienced professional handlers. Fact Fiction

3. A participant in the Amateur Owner Handler class is eligible to enter another class. Fact Fiction

4. A participant in the Amateur Owner Handler class must win their class to complete in another class (i.e., Open). Fact Fiction

5. The Amateur Owner Handler is a replacement for the Novice Class. Fact Fiction

6. The seldom used Novice Class comprises less than 0.2% of regular class entries. Fact Fiction

The reality is there really aren't many details to figure out about the new Amateur Owner Handler (AOH) class! The class is one more regular class of the American Kennel Club. The regular classes now available (in order) are:

- Puppy
- Twelve-to-Eighteen Month
- Novice
- Amateur Owner Handler
- Bred-by-Exhibitor
- American-bred
- Open
- Winners

By definition, the AOH class is for dogs that are at least six months of age that are not champions. Dogs must be handled in the class by the registered owner of the dog and is limited to exhibitors who have not, at any point in time, been a professional dog handler *, AKC approved conformation judge, or employed as an assistant to a professional handler (effective January 1, 2009) (optional class).

The Amateur Owner Handler class differs from the Novice class in the following ways:

1. Handler limitations

AOH: Handled by the registered owner, provided the owner is not a professional.

Novice: No restrictions on the handler.

2. First Prize win limitations

AOH: A dog is eligible for the class until achieving its championship.

Novice: Dogs may not, prior to the date of closing of entries, have won three first prizes in the Novice Class; a first

prize in Bred-by-Exhibitor, American-bred, or Open Classes; or one or more points toward their championship.

GRCA Junior Achievement Award

Each year, the GRCA gives out an award to honor a well-rounded junior who has participated in a variety of activities with their Golden. Past winners have titled dogs in obedience, the field, agility, conformation, and have participated in Junior Showmanship. They have completed 4-H projects and used their Golden in school projects and papers. Others have raised money to support K-9 forces and other local dog organizations in their community.

Please look around your club, community, schools, and 4-H groups for deserving juniors to nominate! 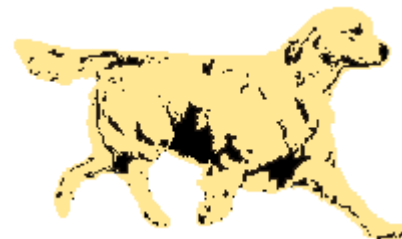

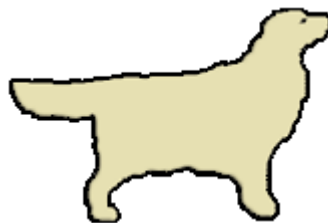
