- Support and further the interests of the Golden Retriever Club of America.

Introducing Your 2006 BGRC Board

This issue we begin introducing your 2006 board with profiles of the new and continuing officers: president Randy Rauth, vice-president Sandi Haessler, treasurer Joan Kaml, and secretary Bill McEachern. In the next issue we will profile the remaining board members and in future issues profile club members new and old.

Randy Rauth is serving his second term as president and was on the board for two years prior to taking on this leadership role. Randy's great love and interest is field work. He put a MH title on Princess (Clearviews Promise Princess) about 7 years ago and a SH title on Thunder (Princesses Rolling Thunder) 2 years ago.

His advice to those pursuing field work with their dogs – recognize the commitment it takes as well as the time and effort involved. One of the great challenges in field competition is competing with the pros. Randy noted that 50% of those dogs who pass a typical hunt test are handled by pros.

For Randy, every time out in the field with his dog is a memorable moment.

Joan Kaml has been a member of BGRC since 1977 and has been training Golden Retrievers for that same

period. She currently has one Golden, 6 ½ year old Jenna (Reddinggold Genuine Risk CD). Previous Golden Retrievers included Penny and Jynx. Penny earned WC and JH titles and Jynx earned six CDXs and JH titles. One of Joan's

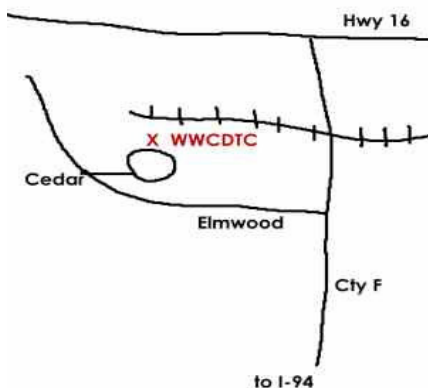

BGRC General Membership Meeting Minutes

November 20, 2005

The meeting was called to order by President Randy Rauth at 7:05 pm. at HAWS.

Treasurer's Report: Joan Kaml reported on the club's checking balance and pending items. Jean Granger moved acceptance of the report and Larry Hartzheim seconded. So moved.

Secretary Report: Renewal is due for our membership to the Dog Federation. Jean Granger moved to renew and Sandy Stoller seconded. So moved.

Information on the Christmas Parade in Mukwonago is available if anyone is interested.

Minutes of the last meeting were read. Joan Kaml moved acceptance and Carol Pacetti seconded. So Moved.

President's Report: Randy Rauth reported that there was a lot of activity on the badgergold listserv and believes it is a great way to let members know what is going on.

Committees Reports:

Membership: Sandy Stoller is the new chair. There was discussion regarding putting ads in the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel like the club used to do years ago. Sandy agreed to check into pricing. A quorum was present. The board identified a variety of membership recruiting activities including mailing flyers and referral cards to area veterinarians, putting promotional flyers in breeder's puppy kits, distributing flyers to breeders at dog shows, and placing ads in the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel. The effectiveness of the Journal Sentinel ads will be assessed at the next general meeting. The board noted that three new members were introduced at the banquet and recognized the efforts of Sandy Stoller in membership recruiting.

There will be fewer vendors at the specialty this year because the county requires a \$75 fee and a signed contract with each vendor. Joan Kaml was able to negotiate a waiver of the county commission on vendor sales exceeding \$500.

Thomas Photography, the specialty photographer, uses digital photography and will therefore have photos immediately available for review and delivery.

The board discussed additional programs for the year. Proposed programs, dates, and locations are listed elsewhere in the newsletter and on the web page.

Other issues discussed by the board included promotion of the

club's video library, web page redesign, and club goals. The board also plans to review current and past awards policies and make recommendations to the membership.

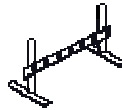

fondlest memories is earning the WC on Penny at the National Specialty BGRC hosted in 1988.

Joan's interests include field, obedience, and rally with obedience being her favorite. She has been president of WWCDTC for 16 years and has been treasurer of BGRC for the past 4 years. Over the years she has held all BGRC officer positions and is currently serving as the 2006 specialty show secretary.

Joan's advice to those beginning obedience training with their dogs – don't give up on your dog (or yourself). Often new handlers, seeing more experienced handlers working with their dogs and earning titles, get discouraged. But Joan points out that every dog's abilities are different and everybody trains differently. Stick to it and you'll achieve your goals and have a great time doing it.

Sandi Haessler has been a member of BGRC since 1990 and has been handling Golden Retrievers for 17 years. Over the years Sandi has been active on the board and served as president for three years, specialty show chair in 2000, and show secretary for several years after that.

Sandi currently has six dogs ranging from almost 13 year old Pony and 7 year old Frankie to the kids: Martha, Graham, Joy, and Jordis. Her current goals are to finish Frankie's (Sandcastle's My Way) championship (a favorite activity); show and finish Martha, Graham, and Joy; and compete in obedience with Jordis. Her proudest achievement was finishing Grace (Am. Can. Ch Keepers Grace Under Fire) as owner-handler with a 5 point major and BOB at Cobo Hall in Detroit.

Sandi's kennel name, Sandcastle Golden Retrievers, is a combination of Sandi's name and a lyric from the Jethro Tull band's song *Thick as a Brick*: "And your sandcastle virtues are all swept

away". For Sandi, this is a reminder to always place her activities as a fancier in perspective of the larger events that occur around us. Sandi's goals as a breeder are to realistically interpret the breed standard and put it together to produce good type, sound, and healthy dogs.

Sandi's favorite dog story relates to Meg who, one spring, came into the house with "the look". Meg often found various life-forms in the yard and loved to bring them to Sandi. With an obedient response to "out", Meg gave up a live baby bird. After creating a warm haven for the young bird, Sandi realized there may be others outside. She put Meg in her tracking harness, gave her the young bird's scent, and went out the back door. On a "find" command Meg went through the wooded yard, stopped dead, and indicated a fallen nest with another young live bird still in it. The young birds were saved and Sandi and Meg enjoyed "the moment" that represented the transition from the frustration of utility training to Meg ultimately earning her UD. She had it!

Sandi's biggest disappointment was Dixie (U-CDX Keepers Dixie Daydream, AmCan CDX) not getting her utility title. Sandi had put her priority on completing Meg's utility title and Dixie took a back seat to that until at 9 years, just when Dixie was ready to compete, she was diagnosed with granulomatous meningeal encephalitis.

Bill McEachern joined BGRC in 2003 as an associate member and became a full member in 2004. In addition to his responsibilities as secretary, he also serves as specialty hospitality chair, newsletter editor, and interim webmaster.

Breeder Referral is primarily a public education service that helps people make educated decisions about buying a Golden Retriever puppy. It is much more than just helping breeders sell puppies! The program is ***designed to educate*** the public and discourage people from purchasing dogs from non-reputable sources. It helps people make educated choices about getting a Golden Retriever and makes sure they have the information they need to successfully raise a dog. Hopefully this program makes strides in preventing impulsive and unwise puppy purchases which result in the kinds of situations that require rescue. We sincerely believe that a sound referral program can pave the way to improving the future of the breed.

Requirements for Participation

- Applicant must have paid dues for 2006 by January 1st
- Applicant must have been a full voting member for two full years (2004 & 2005)
- Applicant must show proof of current GRCA membership and agree to abide by the GRCA "Code of Ethics"
- Applicant must complete and return the attached application to the Education Chairperson no later than January 15th. (Checks payable to BGRC please)
- **Applicant agrees to donate \$25 per litter to the BGRC Education Fund**

Availability and sales contracts are at the sole discretion of the breeders listed. Checking for health clearances are the responsibility of the prospective buyer.

GRCA CODE OF ETHICS

Following you will find the Code of Ethics adopted by the Board of Directors on April 20, 1997. This text was adopted after many revisions, long discussions, review of other national breed clubs' Codes and consideration of input from the membership. The Code's nature is not punitive, but rather a guideline that is informational and states the accepted norm in Golden Retrievers. This Code will appear in the GRCA booklet *Acquiring a Golden Retriever* and in new member packets. New members, by their application, agree to abide by and follow the guidelines outlined in the Code of Ethics. The reaffirmation statement on the annual dues renewal also will note members' agreement to follow the guidelines of this Code.

The Golden Retriever Club of America endorses the following Code of Ethics for its members. It is the purpose of GRCA to encourage its members to perfect through selection, breeding and training the type of dog most suitable in all respects for work as a companionable gun dog, and to do all in its power to protect and advance the interests of Golden Retrievers in every endeavor.

RESPONSIBILITIES AS A DOG OWNER:

Members must ensure that their dogs are kept safe and under control at all times. Members should properly train their dogs so that they are an asset to their community and not a nuisance. Dogs must be maintained with their safety and good health in mind at all times, including adequate and appropriate attention and socialization, grooming, feeding, veterinary attention, housing, routine care, exercise and training.

RESPONSIBILITIES AS A MEMBER OF GRCA:

Members' responsibilities include educating the public about the breed, keeping in mind that they and their dogs represent the breed, the GRCA and the sport of purebred dogs in general.

Members are urged to accept the written breed standard as approved by the American Kennel Club (or the other applicable governing body of the country in which they reside or exhibit) as the standard description of physical and temperamental qualities by which the Golden Retriever is to be judged.

Members are required to maintain good sportsmanship at all events and competitions, abiding by the applicable rules and regulations set forth by the governing bodies for such events and competitions. Members' conduct should always be in accord with the purposes and intent of the GRCA Constitution and By-Laws.

RESPONSIBILITIES AS A BREEDER:

GRCA members who breed Golden Retrievers are encouraged to maintain the purpose of the breed and are expected to demonstrate

honesty and fairness in dealing with other owners and breeders, purchasers of dogs and the general public. Owners of breeding animals shall provide appropriate documentation to all concerned regarding the health of dogs involved in a breeding or sale, including reports of examinations such as those applying to hips and eyes. If any such examinations have not been performed on a dog, this should be stated.

Breeders should understand and acknowledge that they may need to take back, or assist in finding a new home for, any dog they produce at any time in its life, if requested to do so.

Members who breed should sell puppies, permit stud service, and/or lease any stud dogs or brood bitches only to individuals who give satisfactory evidence that they will give proper care and attention to the animals concerned, and who may be expected generally to act within the intent of the statements of this Code of Ethics. Members are encouraged to use clear, concise written contracts to document the sale of animals, use of stud dogs, and lease arrangements, including the use, when appropriate, of non-breeding agreements and/or Limited Registration. Members should not sell dogs at auction, or to brokers or commercial dealers.

ADVISORY GUIDELINES:

Breeding stock should be selected with the objectives of GRCA in mind; that is:

Recognizing that the Golden Retriever breed was developed as a useful gun dog, to encourage the perfection by careful and selective breeding of Golden Retrievers that possess the appearance, structure, soundness, temperament, natural ability and personality that are characterized in the standard of the breed, and to do all possible to advance and promote the perfection of these qualities. (Paraphrased from Article I, Section 2, of the GRCA By-Laws, as amended in 1995.)

GRCA members are expected to follow AKC requirements for record keeping, identification of animals, and registration procedures. Animals selected for breeding should:

- i. be of temperament typical of the Golden Retriever breed; stable, friendly, trainable, and willing to work. Temperament is of utmost importance to the breed and must never be neglected;
- ii. be in good health, including freedom from communicable disease;
- iii. possess the following examination reports in order to verify status concerning possible hip dysplasia, hereditary eye or cardiovascular disease, and elbow dysplasia:
 - a. *Hips* — appropriate report from Orthopedic Foundation for Animals; PennHip; Ontario Veterinary College; BVA/KC Hip Score (Great Britain) or at least a written report from a board-certified veterinary radiologist (Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Radiologists).
 - b. *Eyes* — appropriate report from a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Ophthalmology (ACVO) or from a BVA/KC approved ophthalmologist (Great Britain).
 - c. *Hearts* — appropriate report from a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Medicine, Cardiology Specialty.
 - d. *Elbows* — appropriate report from Orthopedic Foundation for Animals; Institute for Genetic Disease Control in Animals; or at minimum a written report from a board-certified veterinary radiologist (Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Radiologists).

Consideration should be given also to other disorders that may have a genetic component, including, but not limited to, epilepsy, hypothyroidism, skin disorders (allergies), and orthopedic disorders such as osteochondritis.

iv. Assuming all health and examination reports are favorable, the age of the breeding pair also is of consideration. Generally, a Golden Retriever is not physically and mentally mature until the age of 2 years; an individual dog's suitability as a breeding animal is difficult to assess until that time.

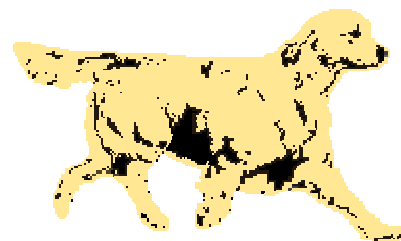

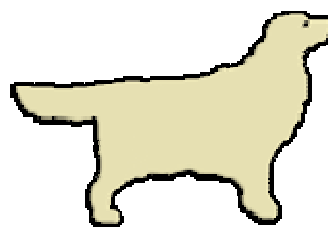
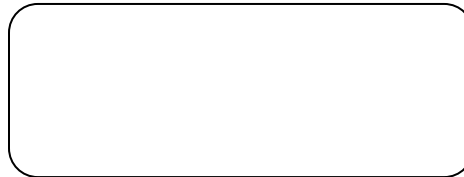
