Message From the President

Hello all,
By the time you read this the Specialty will be behind us and our planning for 2009 well under way.

We begin this year's meetings with a great program on March 29 presented by Dr. Jeff Meinen of EVS. Dr. Meinen received his DVM from the UW-Madison School of Veterinary Medicine in 1990. He then went on to complete his internship in Small Animal Medicine and Surgery at Cornell University and came back to Wisconsin to serve his residency in Small Animal Surgery at UW-Madison School of Veterinary Medicine. In 1999, Dr. Meinen became board-certified in Small Animal Surgery and is currently a diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Surgeons. Dr. Meinen performs many procedures at the Wisconsin Veterinary Referral Center, including arthroscopy.

Arthroscopy is a minimally invasive diagnostic and treatment procedure used for joint disease. This procedure uses a small, rigid, lighted optic tube (arthroscope), which is inserted into the joint through a small incision. Images of the inside of the joint are then viewed on a video monitor.

BGRC General Membership Meeting Minutes

February 1, 2009

The meeting was called to order by President Bill McEachern at 1:27 p.m. at Thunder Bay Grille, Waukesha, WI.

Minutes of the Last Meeting: The minutes of the November 16, 2008 General Membership Meeting were accepted and approved.

President's Report: Bill McEachern thanked all officers and board members for their work in 2008 and for continuing in 2009. Bill thanked Julie Strey Johnson for being the Awards Chairperson and also thanked all workers involved with the upcoming 2009 BGRC Specialty.

Secretary's Report: Carol reported that 33 envelopes containing ballots and cover letters were mailed on January 2, 2009, and January 3, 2009, and 16

voting members returned their ballots to her.

Treasurer's Report: Joan Kaml said there is a positive balance in the BGRC checking account, but expenses slightly exceeded income for 2009.

Committee Reports:

Specialty Report: Edell Schaefer mentioned trophy donations are still needed for the Specialty. Joan, John Stoller, and Edell looked at the show site and had photos available today and copies of the show site layout. Ring stewards are needed in Conformation and Obedience for both days. Joanne Hartzheim is the Food Chairperson, and members are being asked to bring a dessert to the show that would not need refrigeration.

John Stoller is in charge of the show's electrical and asked that people showing bring their own extension cords. Joan mentioned that she had two full-page color ads and a half-page ad for the Specialty catalog. Joan also circulated a sign-up sheet for one-line well-wishing ads for \$2 each. Joan is also looking for breeders' business cards to be in the catalog at a cost of \$10 per card. All ads should be sent to either Joan Kaml or Pat Vanden Heuvel by 2-11-09. Pat Smith mentioned that entries were not down referring to recent area shows; Joan asked members to encourage people to enter the Specialty.

Membership: No report.

Breeder Referral: Pat Smith noted that she received 77 calls up to the November 16, 2008, meeting. A lot were from Illinois. Some were miscellaneous calls.

Field: John thanked all people who helped with the 2008 Hunt

Test and WC/WCX. John also mentioned the Hunt Test is scheduled for Sunday, June 20, 2009, with the WC/WCX scheduled for August 8, 2009, and is looking for volunteers for both. John has four Hunt Test judges scheduled with two judges pending. Due to recent changes in the GRCA rules for the WC/WCX, the chairperson has to be a GRCA member, and a new chairperson is needed.

Obedience: Nothing to Report.

Conformation: Nothing to Report.

Nominating Committee: Bill mentioned the Nominating Committee consisted of Pat Smith, Pat Vanden Heuvel, and Linda Gensch. Since there were no contested positions, Bill made a motion to approve a unanimous ballot for officers and board members continuing in office. The motion was approved.

Old Business: None.

New Business: Sandi Haessler suggested the club consider hosting a CCA Evaluation, a one-day event that is non-competitive. Bill suggested having a broader survey. Edell asked for feedback on cost because of possible future losses. Fundraising would be needed as well as volunteers. Bill suggested that this suggestion be taken under advisement and discussed at a future board meeting.

Pat Smith suggested a fundraiser in which a judge could donate their services and evaluate members' dogs at a minimal cost to club members in the range of \$10 to \$20. Bill suggested this be discussed at a future board meeting.

Joyce Bornheimer suggested having a seminar; the presentation would be given by a nurse on dogs

from Madison. Joyce also suggested a K-9 dental clinic which could be open to the public.

Sandy Stoller said she had some feedback that the cost of the Banquet Luncheon was too expensive. Anyone with ideas should contact Sandy.

Next Meeting: Currently, no General Membership Meeting is scheduled. Dates will be set at the next board meeting on February 11, 2009, at 6:30 p.m.

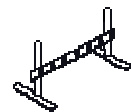

CCA Committee Announcements

The Certificate of Conformation Assessment (CCA) Committee is now authorized to establish a read-only electronic announcement bulletin board to distribute information regarding all aspects of the CCA.

Animal Rescue Site – You Can Easily Help

The Animal Rescue Site is having trouble getting enough people to click on it daily to meet their quota of getting free food donated every day to abused and neglected animals. NEW Amateur-Owner-Handler Class

The GRCA Board of Directors recommends that the host clubs for the 2009 and 2010 National Specialties offer both the Novice and the Amateur-Owner-Handler classes to exhibitors, but that the final decision on whether to offer both classes will be left to the discretion of the host clubs. (The American Kennel Club established an Amateur-Owner-Handler class as a regular class, effective January 1, 2009.)

Veterinarian Recommendations Wanted

As you know, the Golden Retriever Foundation and the Golden Retriever Club of America are committed to promoting research to help reduce the terrible toll that cancer takes on our breed. Your support has been vital to this mission, and the breed always benefits when we join together to accomplish shared goals.

In addition to our financial support, researchers depend on assistance with blood and tumor sample collections to ensure that projects are successful. To improve our efforts, we are in the process of compiling a nationwide database of select veterinarians who have demonstrated a special commitment to working with breeders and rescue organizations. We know there are frequently veterinary practices with excellent reputations that attract knowledgeable clientele from among the local breeder/exhibitor/rescue community, and we need your help in identifying veterinarians in your area who we might contact directly to enlist their personal support and improve sample collection.

We are asking that your club or organization select one or two veterinarians in your local area who may have a large Golden clientele, and who have demonstrated a willingness to work with breeders, scientific curiosity, and commitment to excellence. These can be general practice veterinarians or specialists, but they do not need to be oncologists. It is not necessary for you to discuss this in advance with the veterinarian unless you wish to do so, because we will provide more detailed information directly to the veterinarians. However, should your club or the veterinarian have any questions prior to submitting the contact information, please feel free to contact us at the email or

phone number below. Please take the time now to identify one or more veterinarians to recommend for this purpose, and provide the information requested below. (This does not need to be a formal process that goes through board/club meetings, because a quick response is the most important factor. If you wish to add more names after future meetings with members of your organization, please feel free to do so.)

The research we support has made significant progress in identifying key factors that contribute to canine cancer, and we need to make sure that we maintain momentum to continue that success.

Preliminary Animal Health Notification

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) continues to caution consumers of a potential association between the development of illness in dogs and the consumption of chicken jerky products also described as chicken tenders, strips, or treats. The chicken jerky products are imported to the U.S. from China.

The FDA, in addition to several veterinary diagnostic laboratories in the U.S, is working to determine why these products are associated with illness in dogs. To date, scientists have not been able to determine a definitive cause for the reported illnesses.

AKC Proposed Futures Program – GRCA Response

The Golden Retriever Club of America went on record as being opposed to the Futures Program (proposed by AKC), which is a frozen semen program. In addition to being of concern for breeders,

the program proposes to institute a \$25 activity fee from ALL exhibitors to pay for the Futures Program.

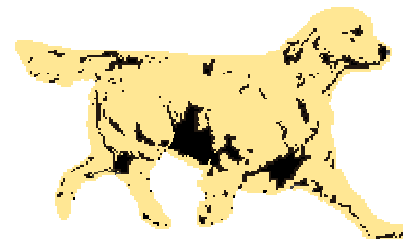

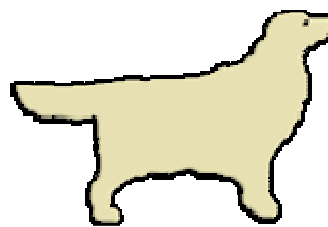
