BGRC General Membership Meeting Minutes

February 7, 2010
Thunder Bay Grille, Waukesha, WI

The meeting was called to order at 1:22 pm by President Bill McEachern. Bill asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the November 15, 2009, General Membership Meeting. Sandi Haessler so moved; Julie Strey Johnson seconded. The minutes were unanimously approved.

Bill thanked members for coming to the Banquet and also thanked Sandy Stoller for organizing the pup/adult dog match-up. Bill also thanked Julie Strey Johnson for organizing and presenting the awards.

Bill thanked the current board members and officers for their service in 2009: Pat Smith, Vice President; Joan Kaml, Treasurer; Carol Pacetti, Secretary; Shirley Wolcyk, Obedience; Jean Taylor, Conformation; John Stoller, Field; Jan Nyland, At Large. Bill also thanked Deb Klemp for her service during the first part of the year. Bill mentioned the new board will be meeting within the next couple of weeks to schedule activities and meetings. Bill announced the new board members are: Sandy Stoller, Vice President; Sandy Flaaten, Obedience; and Dan Feisthommel, Field.

Secretary's Report: Carol said she mailed out approximately 38 letters with ballots and 17 ballots were sent back to her.

Treasurer's Report: Joan announced the club sustained a profit of \$433 with the January Correction Match. A profit of \$225 was also made on club merchandise. Joan also mentioned that any future matches should be all-breed matches. Jan Nyland said the correctional match was fun and successful. John Stoller mentioned that the match should not be on an AKC show weekend. Joan thought it would be a good idea to have two fun matches a year, one in winter, and the other in the fall. Having the matches would also make up for not having a hunt test.

Specialty Report: Sandi Haessler said things are going well with the Specialty. She urged members to be available to help and needs someone on Friday to supervise grooming set-up. Pat Vanden Heuvel and Pat Smith volunteered. Set-up will be during the day on Thursday at 9:00 am and will be for as long as needed. There will be mats to clean and set up to do. Julie Strey Johnson and Josie Trad will decorate after set-up. The raffle table will be in front of the podium between the stairs at the front of the building. Jean Granger needs one steward for Saturday. Jan Nyland volunteered to steward on Friday.

The mats are being borrowed from WKC and not purchased for the first specialty at that location. Mats take a toll on the truck and trailer, and are extremely heavy to move. WKC donated the mats for our use. Pat Smith said food was being provided by a vendor all day Friday and Saturday.

For loading, exhibitors can come through doors on the side. Since there is no one to supervise, people can park in front of the building or in the parking lot and bring their equipment in through the doors. Bill said information

needs to get to the members to fill needed positions in the schedule. Sandy Flaaten will bring the raffle donations.

Their new AKC Political Action Committee collects voluntary contributions from individuals and uses these donations to support candidates who defend dog owners' rights and can effectively influence legislation impacting animal owners. Raisin Toxicity

This week I had the first case in history of raisin toxicity ever seen at MedVet. My patient was a 56-pound, 5 yr old neutered male lab mix that ate half a canister of raisins sometime between 7:30 am and 4:30 pm on Tuesday. He started with vomiting, diarrhea and shaking about 1 am on Wednesday but the owner didn't call my emergency service until 7 am.

I had heard somewhere about raisins AND grapes causing acute renal failure but hadn't seen any formal paper on the subject. We had [the owner] bring the dog in immediately. In the meantime, I called the ER service at MedVet, and the doctor there was like me - had heard something about [the toxicity], but.... Anyway, we contacted the ASPCA National Animal Poison Control Center and they said to give IV fluids at 1 & 1/2 times maintenance and watch the

kidney values for the next 48-72 hours.

The dog's BUN (blood urea nitrogen level) was already at 32 (normal less than 27) and creatinine over 5 (1.9 is the high end of normal). Both are monitors of kidney function in the bloodstream. We placed an IV catheter and started the fluids. Rechecked the renal values at 5 pm and the BUN was over 40 and creatinine over 7 with no urine production after a liter of fluids. At that point I felt the dog was in acute renal failure and sent him on to MedVet for a urinary catheter to monitor urine output overnight as well as overnight care.

He started vomiting again overnight at MedVet and his renal values continued to increase daily. He produced urine when given lasix as a diuretic. He was on 3 different anti-vomiting medications and they still couldn't control his vomiting. Today his urine output decreased again, his BUN was over 120, his creatinine was at 10, his phosphorus was very elevated and his blood pressure, which had been staying around 150, skyrocketed to 220. He continued to vomit and the owners elected to euthanize.

This is a very sad case – great dog, great owners who had no idea raisins could be a toxin. Please alert everyone you know who has a dog of this very serious risk. Poison control said as few as 7 raisins or grapes could be toxic. Many people I know give their dogs grapes or raisins as treats including our ex-handlers. Any exposure should give rise to immediate concern. Onions, chocolate, cocoa, avocados, and macadamia nuts can be fatal too.

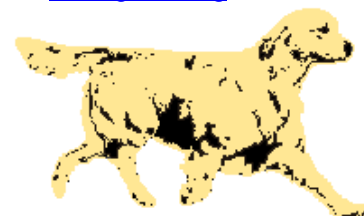

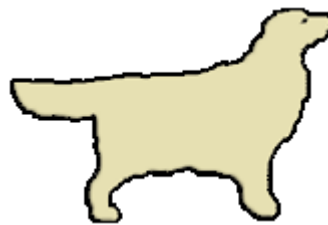
